At the October 21 Board of Education meeting the NJ ASK scores from Great Meadows Middle School and Liberty School and the High School Proficiency Assessment and End of Course Biology scores from Hackettstown High School were presented to the public. As we transition to Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC), it is important that we develop our own grade level benchmark assessments. Scores from the new assessments that our students will take in the spring will be released next fall. In the mean time, our teachers and principals are working very hard to develop quality assessments that will guide instruction for all of our students. The State is closing the chapter on NJ ASK and we will not be able to compare PARCC and ASK scores as they are different assessments. Using our own assessments to monitor student progress will provide teachers and parents with an indicator of student achievement. It will also assist in bridging the gap in the standardized assessment data during this transitional time.

The CST has settled into their new buildings nicely and have been making rounds speaking with students and staff about the goings-on of the new year.

At Central they have been working on updating the Intervention and Referral Service Process with teachers to give added support and definition to how the process can be implemented more seamlessly into the school day. At Liberty, the team worked diligently with Mrs. Gesumaria to create an additional classroom space for a 3rd grade resource room. In the Middle School, the team has been collaborating with teachers on clasdojo and other exciting Google and internet based classroom resources.

In October, the team attended Dyslexia training and will be turnkeying the information to teachers over the next month. Dyslexia affects many students and adults and is gaining attention worldwide. Our team will be evaluating students to ensure proper supports are put into place for struggling students.
