Dear Great Meadows Regional School District Community Members,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Ms. Prymak, Ms. Cicerelle, Mr. O'Melia and Mr. Mailloux for their endless commitment and hours of service provided to our communities and school district over the last seven and a half years. Under my role as Superintendent of Schools, their time spent on the Board of Education enabled the district to develop several successful initiatives, programs and partnerships. In addition, our current Strategic Plan expires on December 31, 2019. Therefore, the district will look to partner with New Jersey School Board Association- NJSBA in developing a new five-year Strategic Plan. My office will disseminate information to our communities as soon as we have definitively scheduled this process next year.

Special Services

The saying about the older we get and the faster time goes is so accurate. I am not sure where the first three months of school have gone and we are now looking at the holiday season.

Though any transition will have bumps, so far the bumps we have encountered with the close of Liberty School have been minor and we are able to successfully navigate around them. The staff is continually working to align and improve instructional the district. practices across instructional Collaborative and productive conversations are happening in each building and I am so excited to be a part of those discussions.

One of the district's professional development goals for this year was to begin to train the staff in Social and Emotional Learning and how to embed it in the classroom. So far to date, the middle school has contracted with Fuel the Joy for curriculum and professional development on teaching mindfulness skills. The trainer met with the staff on October 14th and with parents on October 24th. The Middle School staff will meet with the trainer again on January 20, 2020. Central School has been focusing on Restorative Practices, which is another component of Social and Emotional Learning. The staff was trained on September 3rd and October 14th. Michael Mai also presented it to the parents on October 23rd. Mr. Mai will be attending a Mental Health workshop on December 12th.
