THE LATEST ON COVID-19

- CALI Index: 13.78 daily cases per 100k residents in Northwest Region (as of 8/26/21)
 - Northwest Region: Warren, Morris, Sussex, Passaic
 - ≥ 2nd Lowest in NJ
 - ➤ Warren County in July:
 - O Ages 0−12 − 6% of all new confirmed cases
 - Ages 13–17 9.5% of all new confirmed cases
 - ➤ Warren County in August:
 - o Ages 0−12 − 14% of all new confirmed cases
 - Ages 13-17 10% of all new confirmed cases
- Delta variant of greatest concern due to ease of transmission
- Pfizer vaccine received FDA approval (8/23)

FROM THE STATE

- NJ Governor's Executive Order 251
 - > Mandates mask wearing in all school buildings
 - ➤ Same rules apply from 2020-21
 - Exemptions only if it impacts individual's health
 - Medical documentation required that will be verified by District physician
 - If verified, creation of 504 Plan or amendment to IEP indicating the need for exemption
 - Breaks will be provided
 - Masks not required outdoors; Outdoor learning encouraged
- NJ Governor's Executive Order 253
 - ➤ All staff, volunteers, etc. must be vaccinated or provide proof of testing 1-2 times per week

WHAT IS THE SAME FROM JUNE?

- GMRSD open on a traditional schedule!
- Students maintain three feet of distance in classrooms and six feet in lunchrooms.
- Masks (in school and on buses)
- No guests or meetings during the school day. School-day meetings remain virtual.
- Water fountains remain closed. Bottle fillers available in all schools

WHAT IS THE SAME FROM JUNE?

- Free Covid-19 testing available Tuesdays from 4-7 in GMMS parking lot
- Minimal sharing of supplies
- Hand sanitizer available for all students
- Hand washing encouraged throughout the day
- Classrooms and restrooms sanitized frequently
- Lunch tables cleaned thoroughly in between each lunch period
 - >Lunch is still free of charge

WHAT'S NEW (OR BACK TO THE OLD PROTOCOL)?

- Temperature checks will not be conducted on buses or in car line
 - ➤ Central School will revert to pre-Covid-19 parent drop-off and pickup
- Back to School Night will be in-person (Sept. 23)
 - ➤ Early Dismissal Day
- Breakfast Club
 - >Free for all students P-8
 - >7:30-7:55 @ GMMS
 - >8:15-8:45 @ Central
 - Must be dropped off

WHAT'S NEW (OR BACK TO THE OLD PROTOCOL)?

- Book Fairs, Field Trips, Assemblies, etc. may be scheduled, though changes to health conditions may cause transition to virtual, postponement, or cancellation on short notice.
 - ➤ This includes Washington DC for 8th grade
- Lunch snacks are back!
- More recess (P-3)/outdoor learning
- Ms. Westberg and Ms. Saraiva

- Parents should not send students to school when sick. For school settings, NJDOH recommends that students with the following symptoms be promptly isolated from others and excluded from school:
 - At least two of the following symptoms: fever (measure or subjective), chills, rigors (shivers), myalgia (muscle aches), headache, sore throat, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, congestion, or runny nose; OR
 - At least one of the following symptoms: cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, new olfactory disorder, or new taste disorder.

- ► COVID-19 Exclusion Criteria for Persons Who Have COVID-19 Compatible Symptoms or Who Test Positive for COVID-19:
 - ➤ COVID-19 compatible symptoms who have <u>not</u> been tested or individuals who tested positive for COVID-19 should stay home until at least 10 days have passed since symptom onset and at least 24 hours have passed after resolution of fever without fever reducing medications
 - ➤ Persons who test <u>positive</u> for COVID-19 but who are <u>asymptomatic</u> should stay home for <u>10 days</u> from the positive test result.
 - ➤ An alternate diagnosis (positive strep test or influenza swab, etc.) without a negative COVID-19 test is **not** acceptable for individuals who meet COVID-19 exclusion criteria to return to school earlier.

- COVID-19 Exclusion Criteria for Close Contacts (within 6 ft. for 15 minutes or more over a 24 hour period):
 - > Vaccinated individuals are not considered close contact as long as they are symptom free
 - > 14 days remains the CDC recommendation, HOWEVER
 - Excluded individuals who are close contacts of staff or students who tested positive for COVID-19 may be considered for a reduced exclusion period based on community transmission levels as follows:
 - High or Very High (orange or red) exposed close contacts should be excluded from school for 14 days.
 - Moderate or Low (yellow or green) exposed close contacts should be excluded from school for 10 days (or 7 days with negative test results collected at 5-7 days)

- Exposed close contacts who are fully vaccinated and have no COVID-like symptoms:
 - ➤ Do not need to quarantine, be excluded from school, or be tested following an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19.
 - >Should still monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 for 14 days following an exposure.
 - ➤If they experience symptoms, they should isolate themselves from others and be clinically evaluated (tested) for COVID-19

INSTRUCTION DURING QUARANTINE

- In the event individuals or groups of students must quarantine due to a positive Covid-19 diagnosis, exposure, or close contact, GMRSD will initiate virtual instruction within two (2) school days from the time the individual or group enters quarantine.
- Students will be able to view instruction via Google Meet and teachers will provide assignments, as appropriate.
- All student cameras must be on during instructional time

TRAVEL QUARANTINE

- Domestic Travel
 - Unvaccinated Individuals
 - If tested with a viral test 3-5 days after travel AND quarantine for a full 7 days after travel
 - Even if you test negative, stay home and quarantine for the full 7 days
 - If your test is positive, isolate yourself to protect other from getting infected
 - If you do not get tested, quarantine for 10 days after travel
 - Vaccinated individuals
 - No need to quarantine as long as symptomatic free
- International Travel
 - Same as above except:
 - Vaccinated individuals
 - Tested with a viral test 3-5 days after travel

WORST CASE SCENARIO

- If mandates of 6 feet of distance return:
 - Return to Blue/Green hybrid
 - > 5 full days with alternating Wednesday
 - At-home cohort views classroom instruction via Chromebook
- If we are required to close due to high Covid-19 cases or a community outbreak:
 - Classes held via Google Meet
 - Work assigned via Google Classroom

IN SUMMATION

- It's better, but it's not great.
- Vaccine is important.
- It is no longer uncharted territory.
- We are moving forward as if this were a normal school year and will do so until either:
 - ►It becomes one, OR
 - >We are forced to change course.
- We must stick together and we will get through this!
