SUPERINTENDENT NEWS

Dear Hackettstown and Great Meadows Regional School community members,

As much of the weather is changing, and the earth is defrosting, many of you, as am I, are eagerly awaiting the upcoming warmer seasons. "Spring is a time of plans and projects (*Anna Karenina*, Leo Tolstoy)". As I am sure you have heard, there's a buzz in the air with regard to student enrollment, facility infrastructure, building projects and possible future realignment, all of which are true and have been happening simultaneously between the districts and within our communities. Spring is a time of renewal and rebirth, and we are effortlessly working toward all of these endeavors for a prosperous future

With our communities' commitment in developing the safest and most secure environment for students and staff, our construction for vestibule installation will begin this June, which follows both districts' Strategic Plans. Vestibule installation will be taking place throughout the summer at Central School, Liberty School, Great Meadows and Hackettstown Middle Schools, and Hackettstown High School. As this project nears completion, all 7 of our schools in both districts will have safety and security enhancements, which the Hackettstown and Great Meadows Regional Boards of Education were dedicated in providing for the safety of our students.

In addition to vestibule installation, Hackettstown High School will also conduct three construction projects simultaneously in the form of bathroom upgrades, Hall of Fame lobby, and last but certainly not least, a complete renovation and modernization of our media center. The media center has been three years in the making and will provide our students, staff, and community members a 21st century state-of-the-art active learning environment.

The aforementioned construction projects, albeit all projects, as it pertains to improving our students' school community are only possible with committed board of education members, supportive community members, and secure funds and finances. That said, both boards of education are in the final stages of the budget development process. On Tuesday, April 25, 2017, the Great Meadows Regional School District will present its 2017-2018 proposed budget for approval and following that presentation, my office will present to the board of education and public an optimization of facility study. The following evening, Wednesday, April 26, 2017, the Hackettstown Public School District will present its 2017-2018 proposed budget to the board of education and public for approval. However, we will kick off our meeting on April 26, 2017 by publicly honoring the inaugural class of the Hackettstown High School Hall of Fame. I encourage all community members

to attend both meetings to support our districts' initiatives, honorees, and future vision.

As our districts did last year, we will "give back" the two emergency days which have not been utilized during snow days/other emergencies. Unfortunately, these two days will not coincide between the districts due to the High School Graduation and Project Graduation schedule. Therefore, the Hackettstown School District will be closed on Thursday, May 25, 2017 and Friday, May 26, 2017. The Great Meadows Regional School District will shorten their school calendar by closing school on Monday, June 19' 2017 and Tuesday, June 20, 2017, which will allow the Great Meadows Middle School graduation ceremonies to be conducted on Friday, June 16, 2017. This will also be the last day of school for the entire district of Great Meadows.

Because the next couple of months will be very eventful and busy, below are a list of reminder dates that will keep you up-to-date with our board of education meetings and other school-related events:

From the Great Meadows Regional Business Office...

This is an extremely busy and important time for the staff of the Business Office as we prepare the budget for the 2017-18 school year. The budget year begins July 1, 2017 and ends June 30, 2018. At the same time we are also beginning the process of closing the books in preparation for the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) The CAFR is performed by our auditing firm in order to analyze and report on the financial status of the Great Meadows Regional School District. The financial closing date for the 2016-17 budget year ends on June 30, 2017.

Getting back to the 2017-18 Budget and its pending approval from the Warren County Department of Education, The Great Meadows Regional Board of Education, as part of its regular meeting scheduled for April 25, 2017 will be holding a Public Hearing on the 2017-18 Budget as required by Code and Statute. This meeting is scheduled to be called to order at 7:00 PM in the GMMS Cafeteria and the public is welcomed and encouraged to attend.

Prior to the Public Hearing, the GMRBOE is required by code and statute, to post and advertise in a local newspaper the "Advertised Budget for 2017-18" as a way to make the information available to the public in advance of the Public Hearing. As of now this advertisement is planned to publish in the Warren Gazette on Friday April 21, 2017.

At the Public Hearing a presentation will be made on the proposed budget for the upcoming year. At the conclusion of the public hearing the GMRBOE will then have before it a resolution for adoption of the Final Budget for 2017-2018. This resolution will reaffirm and reflect any changes from the Tentative Budget that was adopted back in March. Hope to see you on the 25th.

While Central does not have the PARCC, we still value the use of data to inform the way we educate our students. One such way is through the Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA), which is administered three times per year to all students in grades 1-2 (kindergarten tests twice) to test reading fluency and comprehension. I am happy to report that, as of January, 84 percent of all Central students are reading at or above benchmark for this point in the year. Keep on reading and keep up the good work!

There are too many spring events to name them all. April 5 is our 3rd joint Principals' Forum. The topic will be the CAP Program's Parent Presentation. It starts at 6 p.m. at Liberty School. This precedes the CAP Program for Grades 1, 3, and 5 that will occur in late April.
