



2025-26 DISTRICT GOALS

GOAL 1: By June 30, 2026, GMRSD will increase student achievement by continually refining instructional practices in all grades to enhance student engagement, utilize data-driven instructional practices, and achieve higher academic outcomes for all students.

GOAL 2: By June 30, 2026, GMRSD will enhance communication throughout the local community using a variety of media.

GOAL 3: By June 30, 2026, GMRSD will improve and enhance special education programs and services that ensure academic, social, and emotional success for special education students and encourage parental engagement.

GOAL #10BJECTIVES

- By June 30, 2026, GMRSD will increase student achievement by continually refining instructional practices in all grades to enhance student engagement, utilize data-driven instructional practices, and achieve higher academic outcomes for all students.
 - Incorporate AI tools in classrooms to personalize learning and provide adaptive instructional support by the end of the academic year.
 - Ensure 100% of instructional staff participates in at least two professional development sessions focused on classroom management, student engagement, deeper learning, special education instructional strategies, and/or Al integration.
 - Demonstrate 10% gain in ELA and Math Link-It Benchmarks from Fall to Spring assessment in grades 2-8, a +3 level gain on DRA from Fall to Spring administration in K-2, and a 10% gain on math benchmark from Fall to Spring administration in K-2.

GOAL #2 OBJECTIVES

- > By June 30, 2026, GMRSD will enhance communication throughout the local community using a variety of media.
 - Rollout of a new district website
 - Publication of a monthly district newsletter
 - Consistent school-based communications
 - Creation of a variety of interactive events virtually and in-person – that encourage staff, parent, and student participation.

GOAL #3 OBJECTIVES

- By June 30, 2026, GMRSD will improve and enhance special education programs and services that ensure academic, social, and emotional success for special education students and encourage parental engagement.
 - Train 100% of general education teachers and special education staff on effective inclusion strategies by the end of the academic year.
 - Provide consistent Special Education Parent Advisory Group (SEPAG) meetings to engage parents and provide valuable information and resources.
 - Conduct quarterly IEP review meetings involving key stakeholders (teachers, parents, administrators) to evaluate and adjust IEP goals and supports.

CELL PHONE POLICY



- > To support school environments in which students can fully engage with their classmates and their teachers, and to focus attention upon instruction, the Board of Education has determined the use of cell phones and other electronic communication devices by students for personal use during the school day and school activities should be limited.
- > Students are prohibited from using an electronic communication device anywhere on school grounds during the school day to include, but not be limited to: during before and after school programs; during any cocurricular activity; and on a school bus.
- Students are encouraged <u>not</u> to bring electronic communication devices to school. If a student chooses to bring an electronic communication device(s) to school, the device(s) shall be <u>turned off</u> by the student and passcode protected to prevent any unauthorized use of the device. The electronic communication device shall remain in the student's <u>backpack/book bag or locker</u> during the school day when its use is not authorized in accordance with Policy and Regulation 5516.

Students with Important Messages (SWIMS)

What is SWIMS?

- A youth engagement program that is composed of Warren County youth interested in learning about substance abuse, addressing issues regarding underage drinking, tobacco, teen dating violence, mental health & more.
- Two Warren Hills High School Seniors developed Seniors with Important Messages, where they educated the freshman and sophomore classes about mental health
- In order to incorporate into different schools and younger student leadership groups, Students with Important Messages was developed.

Mission Statement:

- SWIMS is a program that is found in various chapters within schools throughout the county.
- A youth-led and youth-driven movement whose mission is to reach Warren County youth and empower them to make healthy lifestyle decisions
- How does SWIMS operate within a school?
 - Established throughout the different middle and high schools throughout the county
 - Meetings occur once a month in school, either during lunch periods, activity periods, or after school
 - Youth are encouraged to help develop a tabling activity for the month to educate their peers.

 - Phase 2 2025–26: Addition of Class III SRO
