## The Road Back Moving Forward

#### Virtual Learning

- ➤ Huge obstacles:
  - Student independence
  - Teacher limitations
  - Intense demands on students, parents and staff
  - Resulted in learning loss for many students in all schools

#### Learning Loss

Refers to any specific or general loss of knowledge and skills or to reversals in academic progress, most commonly due to extended gaps or discontinuities in a student's education. While learning loss can manifest in a wide variety of ways for a variety of reasons, the following are a few representative examples of widely recognized forms of learning loss:

#### **Types of Learning Loss**

| Summer break | Interrupted formal education | Returning dropouts |

#### Learning Loss

- **GMRSD** plans to combat learning loss in a variety of ways:
  - Students Achieving More in Summer (SAMS) Program June
    28-August 12 is an expanded extended school year program for
    General Education and Special Education Students
  - Learning Acceleration Formed a committee that has begun to explore the most effective way to combat learning loss and accelerate learning to help our students "catch up"
  - More diagnostic reading assessments
  - Push for mastery of basic skills in ELA and math
  - Regular and frequent checks- progress monitoring

### Getting Back to Normal

- Students Achieving More In Summer (SAMS)
  - > More intensive academic support
  - Expanded days and hours
    - June 28th August 12th (27 days previously 16) 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. (previously 9-11)
    - Increase of 11 days and 2 hours each day
- 70 invitations sent out at the end of April
  - Scheduling for 30 students to participate as of today

#### What It Looks Like

- Student Assessments Link It frequent and regular
- Link It! Intervention Manager
  - Focus on student grade level deficits
  - Regular assessments to determine baselines and progress
  - Specific course for each student based on their needs
- Less whole group instruction and more individualized
- 4 groups (K, 1-3, 4-5 and 6-8)
- Students will rotate math, ELA and science
  - > All certified subject area teachers

#### **Criteria For Summer**

- Students selected based on their 2020-2021 academic performance:
  - ➤ Final grade of 75 or below
  - Have missed 15 days or more of school due to Coronavirus
  - Been a fully remote student for 90 days or more
  - Have teacher recommendation for the program
  - Show a 10% or greater drop in their final grade from the 2020-2021 school year as compared to the 2019-2020 school year.
  - Parent request to enter the program.
  - Benchmark score in the lower 30<sup>th</sup> percentile in ELA and/or math

### Learning Acceleration

- Despite the obstacles that have interfered with education, research shows that it is more effective to teach age-appropriate, grade level standards than to slow down or begin by going backwards.
- In other words, all students will start school in September
  2021 the same way they would had Covid-19 not interfered with their education.

#### Learning Acceleration, cont.

The three biggest keys to doing this successfully are:

- Accurate assessments that provide quality, actionable data (Start Strong, Link-It, DRA, etc.)
  - Students will take benchmarks early where gaps will be identified
- Classroom differentiation
  - > Teachers will individualize instruction to address gaps in the classroom
- Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (RTI, Smart Start, Targeted Assistance Clubs)
  - Programs before, during, and after school will be available to provide further support
